Devil's Gate Sediment Removal Project: Concerns about Air Quality and Nearby Students

Below is a summary created by a few concerned LCHS parents. We are includint it as a courtesy to our parent community as the concerns raised by this issue have been widely expressed. LCHS 9-12 PTSA has not officially endorsed any of the actions listed below and will address the issue at the next PTSA general meeting on November 15th.

LA County will start building entry and exit roads at Devil's Gate Dam in preparation for sediment hauling that will start next April and run through November, for the next four years. Approximately 400-425 diesel-fueled trucks per day (50 trucks per hour) will transfer debris to disposal sites. Hauling routes will be adjusted during the project; however, the primary hauling routes for June - November include Oak Grove and Berkshire Place (driving past Hillsides and LCHS) en route to the 210 freeway on-ramps. Annual maintenance will involve approximately 300 trucks per day during the same hauling season.

The original and revised Environmental Impact Reports circulated according by law during the permitting process did not adequately address the health risks posed to children and teens by the aggressive truck hauling, which assumes diesel trucks conforming to 2010 EPA emission standards. There are recent scientific findings about the impact of ultrafine particles (known carcinogens) on children that were not included in the health risks assessment. Diesel trucks are the primary contributor of these ultrafine particles.

Our hope is to improve the Project's air quality impact on our children, especially for our students who have asthma, heart conditions and other respiratory issues.
